

There are 3 levels to the Fair Employment Charter; Aspiring, Accredited and Ambassador level, ensuring that wherever an employer is on their Fair employment journey there is an appropriate pathway to engaging with the Charter process and developing and demonstrating commitment to good and fair workplaces.

The Charter is anchored in 4 Key Pillars of good work; workplaces that are Fair, Healthy, Inclusive and Just with employers able to demonstrate how their approach and actions meet each of these areas.
